Vermont Law School's Julien and Virginia Cornell Library recently opened the Community Legal Information Corner (CLIC.) Whether you are a self-represented litigant or an individual needing access to legal materials, CLIC is here for you. CLIC provides access to Westlaw (an online legal research service), various legal self-help books and Vermont legal materials. Although the legal materials do not circulate, you may print, download, scan or email your search results. You may also use the CLIC fax.
